As Midsomer Norton Town Council approaches its third birthday, preparations are underway for the Annual Town Meeting which will take place on Monday 12th May at 7pm in the Assembly Room at the Town Hall. The meeting gives an opportunity for the Council to update the town's residents on the progress it has made since last year's meeting whilst setting out what its aims are for the coming Council year.

As well as resident electors coming along to the meeting (46 came to the 2013 meeting), a number of community groups will also be having stalls to promote their organisations and what they offer in the town.

"It's been another busy year where we have been taking forward a number of projects. Our Annual Town Meeting offers a great opportunity to provide a comprehensive update on the wide range of projects that we have been working on to take the town forward as well as taking questions on the issues from residents", said Cllr Paul Myers, Mayor of Midsomer Norton.

Midsomer Norton is facing some challenges and opportunities. Trying to shape development and economic regeneration in the town will continue to test the Council's skills and its determination to deliver what people want for the town. And there are potentially exciting times ahead as they bring their efforts together to try to secure the Town Park and the transfer of vital community assets such as the Town and Orchard Halls and additional green space. This year's meeting will also draw on the recent Community Survey and explore how the Council's priorities for the next year can be matched to what residents have told them.

Midsomer Norton's Town Meeting will be followed at 7pm on the 19th May by the Council's Annual Meeting at which Councillors will elect the Mayor for the coming year and allocate Committee, Working Group and project responsibilities.
