Request for Double Yellow Lines

A request for double yellow lines has been made to B&NES Highways/Road Markings and Signage, as follows:


Midsomer Norton Town Council request that double yellow lines are painted on the Chilcompton Road opposite the junction with Laburnum Grove. The vehicles parked opposite the junction are preventing drivers from turning safely at this junction, particularly as there are often no passing places for cars travelling along Chilcompton road. The junction is often congested and sight lines are particularly poor when turning right out of Laburnum Grove because of the vans and cars parked across the junction.

Back in August, Andy sent the plant list out for pricing to four nurseries (estimating a cost of about £600) and had prices back as follows:

Damage to the Phone Box and Town Park

More antisocial behaviour to report at both the Town Park, and the Phone Box defibrillator at the Somer Centre. A young person has been caught on CCTV throwing stones and breaking the glass panes of the Phone Box defibrillator. Footage has been sent to the Police.

Vandals have again attempted to move the stones at the amphitheatre at the Town Park, and started a fire.

Benches and Bins

Remembrance Sunday - Letter to the Police

Further to our letter to the Police of the 1st November (circulated to all Councillors), regarding their presence at the Remembrance Sunday Parade, a response has been received by email from the BANES, South Glos and Weston Sea Front, Event Planning Officer for Avon and Somerset Police. A copy of which has also been distributed to all Councillors.

MSN Land at Wellow Brook & The Duchy

We wrote to the Duchy of Cornwall, on the 17th October regarding Wellow Brook which we lease from them.

We advised them of the current improvement works including: the creation of a new pathway, selective vegetation being cleared under ecological guidance to provide a view of the brook, a new seating and a picnic area, information signs and a map. We also took the opportunity to enquire as to whether His Royal Highness Prince William, the new Prince of Wales, and Duke of Cornwall, would be interested in coming along to open the site to the public.

We received a response from the Duchy advising that they were pleased to hear of the progress we are making with Wellow Brook Walk. They also thanked us for the kind invitation for his Royal Highness to "open" the Walk, advising that as this is a new and evolving environment in which they are working, it is too early to know how much time the 25th Duke will have for estate visits in the next couple of years (he will also be settling into his other new role as Prince of Wales). However, they will raise the proposal and revert back to us when they have an indication as to whether it might be a possibility.
